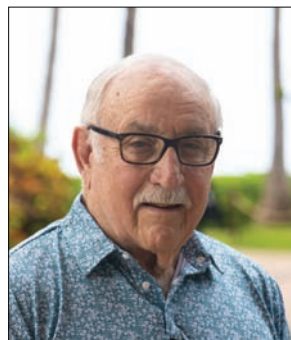

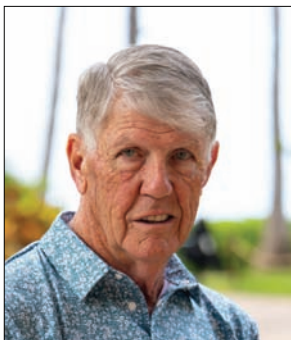

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Each director is elected for a two-year term of office.

Duties of the board of directors include adoption of an annual budget; authorizing disbursements; determining fees, dues and assessments; approving application for, change of classification in and termination of membership; and deciding the time and place of the Annual General Meeting. The board has authority to approve the appointment of committees, to determine the number of appointees to committees and to make rules for the guidance and operation of such committees. The board of directors monitors the activities of all committees and where necessary, gives approval to actions contemplated by committees.

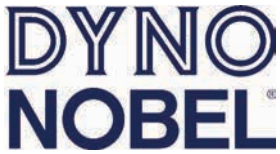

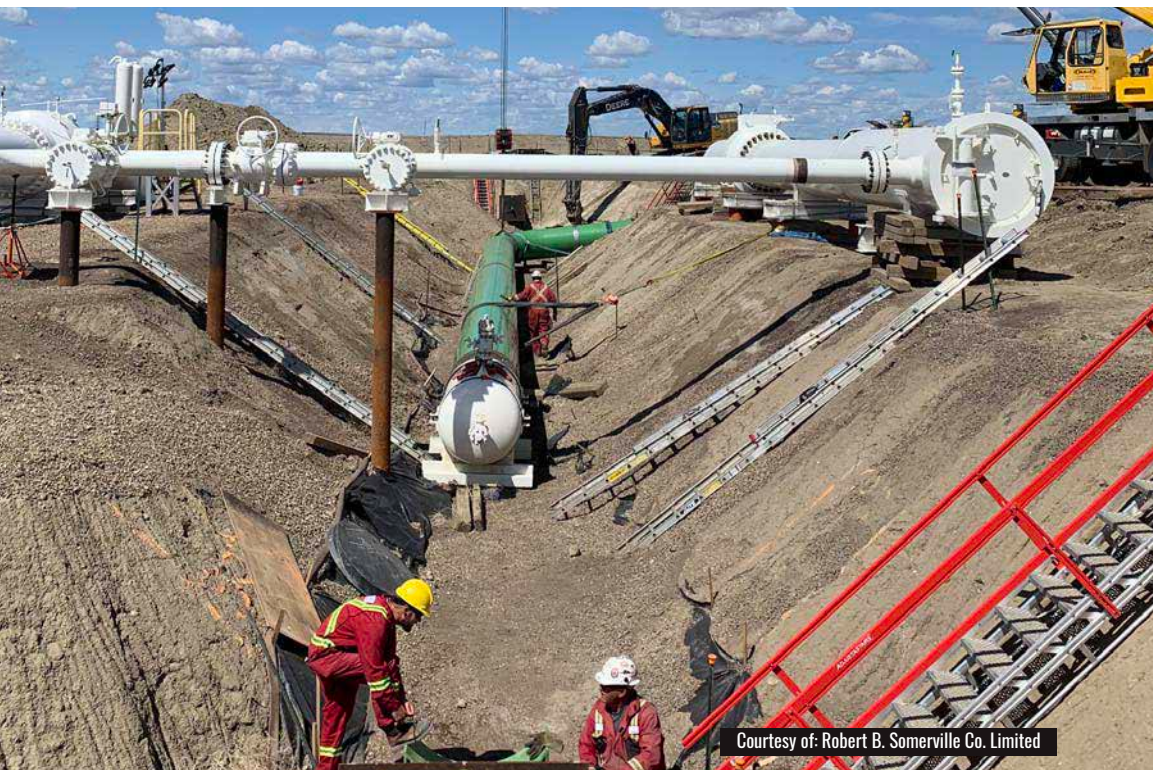

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GENERAL OPERATING BY-LAW NO. 1

A By-law relating generally to the conduct of the affairs of
PIPE LINE CONTRACTORS ASSOCIATION OF CANADA
(the “Corporation”)

WHEREAS the Corporation was continued under the Canada Not-for-Profit Corporations Act S.C. 2009, c.23 by Certificate of Continuance dated August 14, 2013;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED as a general operating By-law of the Corporation to take effect in accordance with section 13.01 of this By-law as follows:

SECTION 1 **INTERPRETATION**

1.01 **Definitions**

In all By-laws and resolutions of the Corporation, unless the context otherwise requires:

- (a) **“Act”** means the Canada Not-for-Profit Corporations Act, S.C. 2009, c. 23, including any Regulations made pursuant to the Act and any statute or Regulations that may be substituted, as amended from time to time.
- (b) **“Articles”** means the original or restated articles of incorporation or articles of amendment, amalgamation, continuance, reorganization, arrangement or revival of the Corporation.
- (c) **“Board”** means the board of directors of the Corporation.
- (d) **“By-laws”** means this by-law and all other by-laws of the Corporation as amended and which are, from time to time, in force and effect.
- (e) **“Director”** means a member of the Board.
- (f) **“Member”** means a member of the Corporation and “Members” or “Membership” means the collective membership of the Corporation.
- (g) **“Officer”** means an officer of the Corporation.
- (h) **“Operating Policies”** means the operating policies approved by the Board in accordance with section 2.08 of this by-law.
- (i) **“Ordinary Resolution”** means a resolution passed by a majority of the votes cast on that resolution.
- (j) **“Regulations”** means the regulations made under the Act, as amended, restated or in effect from time to time.
- (k) **“Special Resolution”** means a resolution passed by a majority of not less than two thirds (2/3) of the votes cast on that resolution.

1.02 **Interpretation**

In the interpretation of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, the following rules shall apply:

- (a) except where specifically defined herein, all terms contained herein and which are defined in the Act shall have the meanings given to such terms in the Act;
- (b) words importing the singular number only will include the plural and vice versa;
- (c) words importing one gender shall include all genders;

- (d) the word “**person**” will include an individual, sole proprietorship, partnership, unincorporated association, body corporate, and a natural person; and
- (e) if any of the provisions contained in the By-laws are inconsistent with those contained in the Articles or the Act, the provisions contained in the Articles or the Act, as the case may be, shall prevail.

SECTION 2

FINANCIAL AND OTHER MATTERS

2.01 Registered Office

- (a) The Corporation shall always have its registered office in the province in Canada specified in the Articles.
- (b) The Directors may change the Corporation's registered office to another place within the province specified in the Articles.

2.02 Seal

The Corporation's seal, if any, shall be in the form determined by the Board.

2.03 Financial Year

Unless otherwise changed by Ordinary Resolution of the Board, the financial year end of the Corporation shall be the last day of December in each year.

2.04 Banking Arrangements

The banking business of the Corporation shall be transacted at such bank, trust company or other firm or corporation carrying on a banking business in Canada or elsewhere as the Board may designate, appoint or authorize from time to time. The banking business or any part of it shall be transacted by an Officer or Officers of the Corporation and/or other persons as the Board may by resolution from time to time designate, direct or authorize.

2.05 Execution of Documents

Deeds, transfers, assignments, contracts, obligations and other instruments in writing requiring execution by the Corporation may be signed by any two (2) of the President, Vice Presidents, Treasurer, or by the Executive Director and any one of the foregoing Officers. In addition, the Board may from time to time direct the manner in which and the person or persons by whom a particular document or type of document shall be executed. Any person authorized to sign any document may affix the corporate seal (if any) to the document. Any Director or Officer may certify a copy of any instrument, resolution, By-law or other document of the Corporation to be a true copy thereof.

2.06 Public Accountant and Level of Financial Review

The Corporation shall be subject to the requirements relating to the appointment of a public accountant and level of financial review required by the Act.

2.07 Annual Financial Statements

The Corporation shall send copies of the annual financial statements, as approved by the Board, and any other documents required by the Act, to the Members and Corporations Canada between 21 to 60 days

before the day on which an annual meeting of Members is held or before the day on which a written resolution in lieu of an annual meeting is signed, unless a Member declines to receive them. Alternatively, the Corporation may give notice to the Members stating that such documents are available at the registered office of the Corporation and any Member may request a copy free of charge at the registered office or by prepaid mail.

2.08 Operating Policies

The Board may adopt, amend, or repeal by Ordinary Resolution such Operating Policies that are not inconsistent with the By-laws of the Corporation relating to such matters as terms of reference of committees, duties of Officers, Board code of conduct and conflict of interest as well as procedural and other requirements relating to the By-laws as the Board may deem appropriate from time to time. Any Operating Policy adopted by the Board will continue to have force and effect until amended, repealed, or replaced by a subsequent resolution of the Board.

SECTION 3 MEMBERS

3.01 Classes and Conditions of Membership

Pursuant to the Articles, there shall be three (3) classes of Members in the Corporation as follows: Regular Members, Associate Members and Honorary Members. Membership in the Corporation shall be available to those who have applied for and been admitted into membership in accordance with the Corporation's Operating Policies. In addition to the requirements established with the Corporation's Operating Policies, there are certain qualifications required for each class of membership, as set out below.

- (a) Regular Members: Any employer of employees, whether an individual, corporation, company, partnership or enterprise engaged in contracting for the construction, installation, treating, reconditioning, or maintenance of pipelines for the purpose of transporting liquids, vapours, slurries or solids, or any phase thereof, shall qualify as a Regular Member. Each Regular Member which is obligated by law to bargain collectively with a trade union which has established trade jurisdiction and the right of collective bargaining for an appropriate unit of employees in the pipeline construction industry in accordance with the legislation of Canada and/or any province or territory shall, where lawfully able, appoint the Corporation as its agent for collective bargaining.
- (b) Associate Members: Any individual, firm or corporation engaged in the business of manufacturing, selling, renting or transporting of materials, supplies, equipment, insurance or bonds for the construction or maintenance of pipelines shall qualify as an Associate Member.
- (c) Honorary Member: Any individual who has performed distinguished service for the pipeline construction industry shall qualify as an Honorary Member. Any such individual shall be nominated by at least two (2) Regular Members and approved by unanimous vote of the Directors.

3.02 Application

Each application for a Regular Member or Associate Member shall be submitted by the applicant, in writing, to the Executive Director in such form and detail as may be prescribed by the Board; shall be accompanied by payment of a membership fee and/or dues in such amount and for such period as may be determined from time to time by the Board and shall contain a promise and covenant to conform to all By laws, Operating Policies and other rules and regulations of the Corporation.

3.03 Admissions

- (a) Upon receipt of an application for membership, the Executive Director shall report this fact to the President and the Directors and thereafter shall conduct such investigation as he/she/they deem appropriate to determine the classification of membership for which the applicant may qualify.
- (b) Upon completing the investigation, the Executive Director shall report his findings to the Board, whereupon such application shall be considered at a duly convened meeting of the Board or at the discretion of the President, such application may be dealt with by mail ballot.
- (c) A majority vote of the Directors shall constitute approval of an application for membership.
- (d) No Officer and no Director shall conduct himself in a manner which is discriminatory in investigating, recommending or voting upon an application for membership and any denial of membership shall be for reasonable cause.

3.04 Status

- (a) In the event that any Regular or Associate Member substantially changes the nature and scope of as business or undertakings as described and outlined in its original application for membership, the Board may, at its discretion, review the membership status of such Member and may change the classification of membership to the appropriate classification.
- (b) In the event that any Regular or Associate Member changes its business title or firm name or changes a partnership or control, such Member shall immediately notify the Executive Director of such change. The Executive Director shall conduct such investigation as he/she/they deem appropriate and shall report his findings to the Board for a determination as to whether the membership status of such Member is subject to change.

3.05 Rights of Members

Each Regular Member of the Corporation shall have the right to receive notice of, attend, speak and participate at all meetings of Members and the right to one (1) vote at all meetings of Members.

Each Associate Member of the Corporation shall have the right to receive notice of and attend, speak and participate at all meetings of Members. Associate Members shall not have the right to vote at meetings of the Members except (i) with respect to the election of up to two (2) Directors as representatives from Associate Members on the Board; or (ii) as otherwise required by the Act.

Each Honorary Member of the Corporation shall have the right to receive notice of and attend, speak and participate at all meetings of Members. Honorary Members shall not have the right to vote at meetings of Members except as otherwise required by the Act.

3.06 Termination of Membership

Membership in the Corporation is terminated when:

- (a) the Member dies, if an individual, or is liquidated or dissolved, if a corporation;
- (b) the Member retires from the pipeline construction business, if the Member is a Regular or Associate Member;
- (c) the Member ceases to maintain the qualifications for membership set out in section 3.01;
- (d) the Member resigns by delivering a written resignation to the Board in which case such resignation shall be effective on the date specified in the resignation;

- (e) the Member is removed as a Member of the Corporation in accordance with section 3.08;
- (f) the Member's term of membership expires, if any; or
- (g) the Corporation is liquidated or dissolved under the Act.

Subject to the Articles, upon any termination of membership, the rights of the Member automatically cease to exist.

3.07 Membership Dues

The Directors may determine by a Special Resolution the amount and the manner in which membership dues, fees or any special assessments as may be necessary for specific purposes are to be paid. Members shall be notified in writing of the dues payable at any time by them and, if any are not paid within three (3) calendar months of the membership renewal date, the Members in default shall thereupon cease to be Members of the Corporation. Honorary Members shall not be required to pay any dues, fees or special assessments. The Board may, in its discretion, extend the time for payment of such fees, dues or assessments.

3.08 Discipline of Members

The Board may suspend or remove any Member from the Corporation for any one or more of the following grounds:

- (a) violating any provision of the Articles, By-laws, or Operating Policies of the Corporation;
- (b) carrying out any conduct which may be detrimental to the Corporation as determined by the Board in its sole discretion; and/or
- (c) for any other reason that the Board in its sole and absolute discretion considers to be reasonable, having regard to the purposes of the Corporation.

Further, any Member can accuse another Member in writing of conduct prejudicial to the interests of the Corporation and its Members or of continued breach of the By laws, Rules and Regulations of the Corporation.

In the event that the Board of any Member proposes that a Member should be expelled or suspended from membership in the Corporation, the Chair of the Board shall provide twenty (20) days' notice of suspension or removal to the Member and shall provide reasons for the proposed suspension or removal. The Member may make written submissions to the Chair of the Board in response to the notice received within such twenty (20) day period. In the event that no written submissions are received by the Chair of the Board, he/she/they may proceed to notify the Member that the Member is suspended or removed from membership in the Corporation. Where written submissions are received in accordance with this section, the Board will consider such submissions in arriving at a final decision and shall notify the Member concerning such final decision within a further twenty (20) days from the date of receipt of the submissions. A Special Resolution of the Board shall be necessary to suspend or expel a Member. If said Member appeals the decision of the Board, a Special Resolution of the Regular Members as a whole shall be required to nullify the Board's decision.

3.09 Reinstatement

If any Member is expelled for reasonable cause, application for reinstatement must be made in the same manner as an application for new membership.

3.10 Representation

Each Regular and Associate Member shall designate one representative who is employed by that Member who shall be eligible for election to the Board and shall nominate such other representatives as may be available for appointment to Standing Committees. Such designation and any future changes to such designation shall be in writing and filed annually, or immediately following any change to such designation, in registered office of the Corporation.

SECTION 4

MEETINGS OF MEMBERS

4.01 Annual Meetings

An annual meeting of Members shall be held at such time in each year, as the Board may from time to time determine, provided that the annual meeting must be held not later than fifteen (15) months after holding the preceding annual meeting and no later than six (6) months after the end of the Corporation's preceding fiscal year. The annual meeting shall be held for the purpose of considering the financial statements and reports of the Corporation required by the Act to be presented at the meeting, electing Directors, appointing the public accountant and transacting such other business as may properly be brought before the meeting or is required under the Act.

4.02 Special Meetings

The President may at any time call a special meeting of Members for the transaction of any business which may properly be brought before the Members. The Directors of the Corporation may at any time call a special meeting of Members. On written requisition by Members carrying not less than five percent (5%) of the votes that may be cast at a meeting of Members sought to be held, the Board shall call a special meeting of Members, unless the exceptions in the Act are met. If the Directors do not call a meeting within twenty-one (21) days of receiving the requisition, any Member who signed the requisition may call the meeting.

4.03 Place of Meetings

Meetings of Members may be held at any place within Canada as the Board may determine or outside Canada if all of the Members entitled to vote at such meeting so agree.

4.04 Special Business

All business transacted at a special meeting of Members and all business transacted at an annual meeting of Members, except consideration of the financial statements, public accountant's report, election of Directors and re-appointment of the incumbent public accountant, is special business.

4.05 Notice of Meetings

- (a) In accordance with and subject to the Act, notice of the time and place of a meeting of Members shall be given to each Member entitled to vote at the meeting by the following means:
 - (i) by mail, courier or personal delivery to each Member entitled to vote at the meeting, during a period of 21 to 60 days before the day on which the meeting is to be held; or

- (ii) by telephonic, electronic or other communication facility to each Member entitled to vote at the meeting, during a period of 21 to 35 days before the day on which the meeting is to be held.
- (b) Where the Corporation provides notice electronically, as referred to in section 4.05(a)(ii), and if a Member requests that notice be given by non-electronic means, the Corporation shall give notice of the meeting to the Member so requesting in the manner set out in section 4.05(a)(i).
- (c) Notice of a meeting of Members shall also be given to each Director and to the public accountant of the Corporation during a period of 21 to 60 days before the day on which the meeting is to be held.
- (d) Notice of any meeting of Members at which special business is to be transacted shall state the nature of that business in sufficient detail to permit the Member to form a reasoned judgment on the business and provide the text of any Special Resolution or By-law to be submitted to the meeting.
- (e) The Directors may fix a record date for determination of Members entitled to receive notice of any meeting of Members in accordance with the requirements of section 161 of the Act.

4.06 Waiving Notice

A Member and any other person entitled to attend a meeting of Members may in any manner and at any time waive notice of a meeting of Members, and attendance of any such person at a meeting of Members is a waiver of notice of the meeting, except where such person attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business on the grounds that the meeting is not lawfully called.

4.07 Persons Entitled to be Present

The only persons entitled to be present at a meeting of Members shall be those entitled to vote at the meeting, the Directors, the Officers and the public accountant of the Corporation and such other persons who are entitled or required under any provision of the Act, Articles or By-laws of the Corporation to be present at the meeting. Any other person may be admitted only on the invitation of the chair of the meeting or by Ordinary Resolution of the Members.

4.08 Chair of the Meeting

The chair of Members' meetings shall be the Chair of the Board or the Vice-Chair of the Board if the Chair of the Board is absent or unable to act. In the event that the Chair of the Board and the Vice-Chair of the Board are absent, the Members who are present and entitled to vote at the meeting shall choose a Member to chair the meeting.

4.09 Quorum

Subject to the Act, a quorum at any meeting of the Members shall be a quarter (25%) of the Regular Members in attendance in person or by duly appointed proxy. If a quorum is present at the opening of a meeting of Members, the Members present may proceed with the business of the meeting even if a quorum is not present throughout the meeting. For the purpose of determining quorum, a Member may be present in person, by proxy or by telephonic and/or by other electronic means.

4.10 Meetings Held by Electronic Means

A Members meeting may be held by telephonic or electronic means in accordance with the Act as follows:

- (a) Any person entitled to attend a meeting of Members may participate in the meeting by means

of such telephonic, electronic or other communication facility that permits all participants to communicate adequately with each other during the meeting, if the Corporation makes available such a communication facility and the meeting complies with the requirements in the Act and the Regulations. A person participating in a meeting by such means is deemed to be present at the meeting.

- (b) Notwithstanding clause (a), if the Directors or Members of the Corporation call a meeting of Members, those Directors or Members, as the case may be, may determine that the meeting be held, in accordance with the Act and the Regulations, entirely by means of a telephonic, electronic or other communication facility that permits all participants to communicate adequately with each other during the meeting.
- (c) Any person participating in a meeting of Members by means of a telephonic, electronic or other communication facility and entitled to vote at such meeting, may vote using the communication facility that the Corporation has made available for that purpose. When a vote is to be taken at a meeting of Members, the voting may be carried out by means of a telephonic, electronic or other communication facility only if that facility enables the votes to be gathered in a manner that permits their subsequent verification; and permits the tallied votes to be presented to the Corporation without it being possible for the Corporation to identify how each Member voted.

4.11 Absentee Voting by Mailed-In Ballot or Electronic Ballot

A Member entitled to vote at a meeting of Members may vote by mailed-in ballot or may vote by means of a telephonic, electronic or other communication facility if the Corporation has prescribed by Operating Policies the procedures for collecting, counting, and reporting the results of any vote that enable the votes to be gathered in a manner that permits their subsequent verification, and permit the tallied votes to be presented to the Corporation without it being possible for the Corporation to identify how each Member voted.

4.12 Absentee Voting by Proxy

Every Member entitled to vote at a meeting of Members may appoint a proxyholder, or one or more alternate proxyholders, who must be a representative of a Regular Member, to attend and act at the meeting in the manner and to the extent authorized by the proxy and with the authority conferred by it subject to the following:

- (a) a proxy is valid only at the meeting in respect of which it is given or at a continuation of the meeting after an adjournment;
- (b) a Member may revoke a proxy by depositing an instrument in writing to the Executive Director executed by the Member in accordance with the Regulations;
- (c) a proxyholder or an alternate proxyholder has the same rights as the Member by whom he/she/they were appointed, including the right to speak at a meeting of Members in respect of any matter, to vote by way of ballot at the meeting, to demand a ballot at the meeting and, except where a proxyholder or alternate proxyholder has conflicting instructions from more than one Member, to vote at the meeting by way of a show of hands;
- (d) a proxy shall be in writing, executed by the Member or such Member's attorney and shall conform with the requirements of the Regulations; and
- (e) votes by proxy shall be collected, counted and reported in such manner as the chair of the meeting directs.

4.13 Voting

- (a) At any meetings of the Members, every question shall, unless otherwise provided by the Articles or By-laws or by the Act, be determined by Ordinary Resolution. In case of an equality of votes, the motion or resolution is defeated.
- (b) Each Regular Member shall be entitled to one (1) vote on all matters of business arising at meetings of the Members. Such vote may be cast by a representative of such Member in attendance in person or by duly appointed proxy.
- (c) Each Associate Member shall not be entitled to vote on any matters of business arising at meetings of the Members, except that each Associate Member shall be entitled to one (1) vote solely in the election of the Director from the Associate membership, or on such matters as required by the Act.
- (d) Honorary Members shall only be entitled to vote on such matters as required by the Act, but may discuss any issue before a meeting when called upon by the President.

4.14 Resolution in Lieu of Meeting

A resolution in writing and signed by all of the Members entitled to vote on that resolution at a meeting of Members is as valid as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Members, unless a written statement is submitted to the Corporation by a Director or by the public accountant in relation to their resignation, removal or replacement. A copy of every resolution of the Members shall be kept with the minutes of meetings of Members.

SECTION 5 DIRECTORS

5.01 Powers

Subject to the Act and the Articles, the Board shall manage or supervise the management of the activities and affairs of the Corporation.

5.02 Number of Directors

- (a) The Board shall consist of a number of Directors between the minimum and maximum number of Directors specified in the Articles. The precise number of Directors on the Board shall be determined from time to time by the Members by Ordinary Resolution, or, if the Ordinary Resolution empowers the Directors to determine the number of Directors, by resolution of the Board.
- (b) Until changed in accordance with section (a) above, the Board shall be comprised of the following:
 - (i) Up to nine (9) representatives from the Regular Members; and
 - (ii) Up to two (2) representatives from the Associate Members.

For greater certainty, no representatives of Honorary Members shall be on the Board.

5.03 Qualifications

Each Director shall be an individual who is not less than eighteen (18) years of age. Each Director shall be a Member of the Corporation in good standing. No person who has been declared by a court in Canada or

elsewhere to be incapable, and has the status of a bankrupt shall be a Director. Each Director shall be a designated representative of a Regular Member or an Associate Member, in accordance with section 5.02 (b) of this By-law.

5.04 Election of Directors and Term

- (a) Subject to the Articles, Directors shall be elected by the Members by Ordinary Resolution at an annual meeting of Members at which an election of Directors is required.
- (b) The terms of office of Directors shall be two (2) years or as determined by Ordinary Resolution of the Members.
- (c) In the event that the President of the Corporation has, at the conclusion of his term as President, completed two (2) years as a member of the Board, he/she/they shall automatically continue for a further two (2) year term.
- (d) If Directors are not elected at a meeting of Members, the incumbent Directors shall continue in office until their successors are elected.
- (e) Directors shall be eligible for re-election without limitation.
- (f) The Board may establish a nominating committee, the details of which shall be set forth in the Operating Policies. In that event, the nominating committee will present a report to the Members for the election of Directors and such report will be prepared in accordance with the requirements of this By-law and the Operating Policies.

5.05 Appointment of Directors

Pursuant to the Articles, following the conclusion of the annual meeting of Members each year, the Board may appoint Directors (the "appointed Directors") to hold office for a term expiring not later than the close of the next annual meeting of Members. The number of appointed Directors shall not exceed one-third (1/3) of the number of Directors elected by the Members at the previous annual meeting of Members.

5.06 Remuneration

- (a) The Directors shall serve as such without remuneration and no Director shall directly or indirectly receive any profit from their position as such provided that a Director may be reimbursed reasonable expenses incurred by the Director in the performance of their duties.
- (b) The Board may, by resolution, authorize the payment of remuneration for reasonable expenses incurred by committee chairs, committee members, or any other individuals specifically requested or authorized by the President or a committee chair to attend meetings of committees or sub-committees.

5.07 Ceasing to Hold Office

A Director ceases to hold office when the Director dies, resigns, is removed from office by the Members in accordance with section 5.09, or no longer fulfils all of the qualifications to be a Director set out in section 5.03, as determined in the sole discretion of the Board.

5.08 Resignation

A resignation of a Director becomes effective at the time a written resignation is sent to the Corporation or at the time specified in the resignation, whichever is later.

5.09 Removal

The Members may, by Ordinary Resolution, passed at a meeting of Members, remove any Director from office before the expiration of the Director's term and may elect a qualified individual to fill the resulting vacancy for the remainder of the term of the Director so removed, failing which such vacancy may be filled by the Board.

5.10 Filling Vacancies

In accordance with and subject to the Act and the Articles, a quorum of the Board may fill a vacancy in the Board, except a vacancy resulting from an increase in the number of the minimum or maximum number of Directors, or from a failure of the Members to elect the number of Directors required to be elected at any meeting of Members. If there is not a quorum of the Board, or if the vacancy has arisen from a failure of the Members to elect the number of Directors required to be elected at any meeting of Members, the Board shall forthwith call a special meeting of Members to fill the vacancy. If the Board fails to call such meeting or if there are no Directors then in office, any Member may call the meeting. A Director appointed or elected to fill a vacancy holds office for the unexpired term of their predecessor.

SECTION 6

MEETINGS OF DIRECTORS

6.01 Calling of Meetings

Meetings of the Board may be called by the President or upon the written request of any two (2) Directors at any time.

6.02 Place of Meetings

Meetings of the Board may be held at the registered office of the Corporation or at any other place within or outside of Canada, as the Board may determine.

6.03 Notice of Meeting

- (a) Notice of the time and place for the holding of a meeting of the Board shall be given in the manner provided in section 11.01 of this By-law to every Director of the Corporation not less than seven (7) days before the time when the meeting is to be held.
- (b) Notice of a meeting shall not be necessary if all of the Directors are present, and none objects to the holding of the meeting, or if those absent have waived notice of or have otherwise signified their consent to the holding of such meeting. Notice of an adjourned meeting is not required if the time and place of the adjourned meeting is announced at the original meeting.
- (c) Unless the By-law otherwise provides, no notice of meeting need specify the purpose or the business to be transacted at the meeting except that a notice of meeting of Directors shall specify any matter referred to in subsection 138(2) of the Act that is to be dealt with at the meeting.

6.04 Regular Meetings

The Board shall meet each year after the Annual General Meeting of the Members, and may appoint a day or days in any month or months for regular meetings of the Board at a place and hour to be named. A copy of any resolution of the Board fixing the place and time of such regular meetings of the Board shall be sent to each Director forthwith after being passed, but no other notice shall be required for any such regular

meeting except if notice is required to be given because a matter referred to in subsection 138(2) of the Act, is to be dealt with at the meetings.

6.05 No Alternate Directors

No person shall act for an absent Director at a meeting of the Board.

6.06 Participation at Meeting by Telephone or Electronic Means

If all of the Directors consent, a Director may, in accordance with the Regulations, participate in a Board meeting, by means of a telephonic, electronic or other communications facility that permits all participants to communicate adequately with each other during the meeting. A Director participating in the meeting by such means shall be deemed for the purposes of the Act to have been present at that meeting. A consent pursuant to this section may be given before or after the meeting to which it relates and may be given with respect to all meetings of the Board and committees of the Board.

6.07 Quorum

Majority of Directors in office constitutes a quorum of any meeting of the Board. For the purpose of determining quorum, a Director may be present in person, or, if authorized under this By-law, by teleconference and/or by other electronic means.

6.08 Votes to Govern

Each Director may exercise one (1) vote. At all meetings of the Board, every question shall be decided by a majority of the votes cast on the question. In case of an equality of votes, the motion or resolution is defeated.

6.09 Dissent at Meeting

Subject to the Act, a Director who is present at a Board meeting or a meeting of a committee of Directors is deemed to have consented to any resolution passed or action taken at the meeting unless:

- (a) the Director requests a dissent to be entered in the minutes of the meeting; or
- (b) the Director sends a written dissent to the secretary of the meeting before the meeting is adjourned; or
- (c) the Director sends a dissent to the Chair of the Board by registered mail or delivers it to the registered office of the Corporation immediately after the meeting is adjourned;

provided that a Director who votes for or consents to a resolution may not dissent.

6.10 Dissent of Absent Director

A Director who was not present at a meeting at which a resolution was passed or action taken is deemed to have consented to the resolution or action unless, within seven (7) days after becoming aware of the resolution or action, the Director:

- (a) causes a dissent to be placed with the minutes of the meeting; or
- (b) sends a dissent to the Chair of the Board by registered mail or delivers it to the registered office of the Corporation.

6.11 Resolutions in Writing

A resolution in writing, signed by all the Directors entitled to vote on that resolution at a Board meeting, shall be as valid as if it had been passed at a Board meeting. A copy of every such resolution in writing shall be kept with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board or committee of Directors.

SECTION 7 COMMITTEES

7.01 Delegation – Executive Committee

- (a) The Board may appoint from their number a managing director or a committee of Directors (which may be referred to as an executive committee) and delegate to the managing director or committee any of the powers of the Board, except those which may not be delegated by the Board in accordance with subsection 138(2) of the Act, as follows:
 - (i) to submit to the Members any question or matter requiring the Members' approval;
 - (ii) to fill a vacancy among the Directors or in the office of public accountant;
 - (iii) to appoint additional Directors;
 - (iv) to issue debt obligations except as authorized by the Directors;
 - (v) to approve any annual financial statements;
 - (vi) to adopt, amend or repeal By laws; or
 - (vii) to establish contributions to be made, or dues to be paid, by Members.
- (b) Unless otherwise determined by the Board, such a committee shall have the power to fix its quorum at not less than a majority of its members, to elect its chair and to otherwise regulate its procedure.

7.02 Audit Committee

If the Board establishes or appoints an audit committee, the following provisions shall apply:

- (a) the audit committee shall be composed of not less than three (3) Directors, a majority of whom are not Officers or employees of the Corporation or any of its affiliates;
- (b) the audit committee shall review the Corporation's financial statements before they are approved by the Directors;
- (c) the Corporation shall send the public accountant notice of the time and place of any meeting of the audit committee. The public accountant is entitled to attend the meeting at the expense of the Corporation and be heard, and shall attend every meeting of the committee if requested to do so by one of the committee's members; and
- (d) the public accountant or a member of the audit committee may call a meeting of the committee.

7.03 Other Committees

- (a) The Board may from time to time appoint any committee or other advisory body as it deems necessary or appropriate for such purposes and, subject to the Act, with such powers as the Board shall see fit. The Board may fix any remuneration for committee members who are not also Directors.
- (b) Any such committee may formulate its own rules of procedure, subject to any Operating

- Policies or such other regulations or directions as the Board may from time to time make.
- (c) Any committee member (including a member of an executive committee or audit committee) may be removed by resolution of the Board.

SECTION 8 OFFICERS

8.01 Officers

The officers of the Corporation shall include:

- (a) a President;
- (b) a First Vice-President;
- (c) a Second Vice-President;
- (d) a Treasurer; and
- (e) an Executive Director;

and may include any such other officers as the Directors may appoint in accordance with subsection 8.02(c) of this By-law.

8.02 Appointment

- (a) The officers, other than the Executive Director, shall be appointed by the Directors at the first meeting of the Board held after the annual meeting of Members, or at such other time as the circumstances may require.
- (b) The Executive Director shall be appointed by the President, subject to the approval of the Board and retained by the Corporation as an employee or independent contractor. The Executive Director's salary shall be determined by the Board.
- (c) The Board may from time to time appoint such other officers and agents as it shall deem necessary who shall have such authority and shall perform such duties as may from time to time be prescribed by the Board.
- (d) A Director may be appointed to any office of the Corporation. An Officer may, but need not be, a Director unless this By-law otherwise provides. Two or more offices may be held by the same person.

8.03 Description of Offices

Unless otherwise specified by the Board (which may, subject to the Act, modify, restrict or supplement such duties and powers), the offices of the Corporation, if designated and if Officers are appointed thereto, shall have the following duties and powers associated therewith, as well as such other duties and powers as the Board may specify from time to time:

- (a) **President of the Board** - The President shall be Chair of the Board and shall be a Director. The Chair of the Board shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Board and of the Members.
- (b) **Vice-President and Second Vice-President of the Board** - The Vice-President and Second Vice-President shall serve respectively as Vice-Chair and Second Vice-Chair of the Board and shall be Directors. If the Chair of the Board is absent or is unable or refuses to act, the Vice-

Chair of the Board shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Board and of the Members and be members of the Executive Committee.

- (c) **Treasurer** - The Treasurer shall be a Director and be responsible for the maintenance or for overseeing the maintenance of proper accounting records in compliance with the Act as well as the deposit of money, the safekeeping of securities and the disbursement of funds of the Corporation; whenever required, the Treasurer shall render to the Board an account of all such person's transactions as Treasurer and of the financial position of the Corporation. The Treasurer shall be a member of the Executive Committee.
- (d) **Executive Director** - The Executive Director shall supervise the day to day operations and administration of the Corporation, be a member of the Executive Committee, an advisory member of the Board. The Executive Director shall carry out the duties of the Corporation's secretary generally and shall attend, or cause a recording secretary to attend, all meetings of the Board, the Members, and committees. The Board may delegate to the Executive Director the power to manage and direct the business and affairs of the Corporation and to employ and discharge agents and employees of the Corporation. The Executive Director shall conform to all lawful orders given by the Board of the Corporation and shall at all reasonable times give to the Board all information it may require regarding the affairs of the Corporation.
- (e) The duties of all other Officers of the Corporation shall be such as the terms of their engagement call for or the Board or the Chair requires of them. The Board may from time to time and subject to the Act, vary, add to or limit the powers and duties of any Officer.

8.04 Term of Office

- (a) Officers shall be appointed by the Board at the first meeting of the Board immediately following the annual meeting of Members and shall hold their position for a period of one (1) year or as otherwise determined by resolution of the Board.
- (b) In those cases where an Officer is appointed by the Board to fill a mid-term vacancy such Officer shall hold office until the first meeting of the Board immediately following the annual meeting of Members.

8.05 Vacancy in Office

In the absence of a written agreement to the contrary, the Board may remove, whether for cause or without cause, any Officer of the Corporation. Unless so removed, an Officer shall hold office until the earlier of:

- (a) the Officer's successor being appointed;
- (b) the Officer's resignation;
- (c) such Officer ceasing to be a Director (if a necessary qualification of this appointment); or
- (d) such Officer's death.

If the office of any Officer of the Corporation shall be or become vacant, the Board may appoint a person to fill such vacancy.

SECTION 9

CONFLICT OF INTEREST AND CONFIDENTIALITY

9.01 Conflict of Interest

- (a) Every Director and Officer shall disclose to the Corporation:
 - (i) the nature and extent of any interest that the Director or Officer has in a material contract or material transaction, whether made or proposed, with the Corporation; and
 - (ii) the nature and extent of any other interest that the Director or Officer has that may constitute a conflict of interest.
- (b) Any such disclosure shall be made in accordance with the requirements of the section 141 of the Act and any Operating Policy of the Board on conflicts of interest.

9.02 Confidentiality

- (a) Every Director, Officer, committee member, employee and volunteer, shall respect the confidentiality of matters brought before the Board or before any committee of the Board.
- (b) Employees and volunteers shall also keep confidential matters that come to their attention as part of their employment or volunteer activities.
- (c) If requested by the Corporation, each Director, Officer, committee member, employee and volunteer, shall sign an agreement to this effect.

SECTION 10

PROTECTION OF DIRECTORS, OFFICERS AND OTHERS

10.01 Standard of Care

Every Director and Officer of the Corporation in exercising their powers and discharging their duties shall:

- (a) act honestly and in good faith with a view to the best interests of the Corporation; and
- (b) exercise the care, diligence and skill that a reasonably prudent person would exercise in comparable circumstances.

10.02 Indemnification of Directors and Others

- (a) Provided the individual meets the requirements of section 10.02(c), the Corporation may indemnify a present or former Director or Officer of the Corporation, or another individual who acts or acted at the Corporation's request as a Director or an Officer or in a similar capacity of another entity, against all costs, charges and expenses, including an amount paid to settle an action or satisfy a judgment, reasonably incurred by the individual in respect of any civil, criminal, administrative, investigative or other proceeding in which the individual is involved because of that association with the Corporation or other entity.
- (b) The Corporation may advance money to a Director, an Officer or other individual for the costs, charges and expenses of a proceeding referred to in section 10.02(a). The individual shall repay the money if the individual does not fulfill the conditions of section 10.02(c).

- (c) To qualify for an indemnity, an individual must have:
 - (i) acted honestly and in good faith with a view to the best interests of the Corporation or, as the case may be, to the best interests of the other entity for which the individual acted as Director or Officer or in a similar capacity at the Corporation's request; and
 - (ii) in the case of a criminal or administrative action or proceeding that is enforced by a monetary penalty, had reasonable grounds for believing that their conduct was lawful.

10.03 Insurance

Subject to the Act and applicable laws, the Corporation may purchase and maintain insurance for the benefit of an individual referred to in section 10.02 of this By-law, against any liability incurred by that individual in the individual's capacity as a Director or an officer of the Corporation, or, in the individual's capacity as a director or officer, or in a similar capacity, of another entity if the individual acts or acted in that capacity at the Corporation's request.

SECTION 11 NOTICES

11.01 Method of Giving Notices

- (a) Subject to sections 4.05 and 6.03, any notice to be given (which term includes sent, delivered or served) pursuant to the Act, the Articles, the By-laws or otherwise to the Corporation, a Member, Director, Officer, member of a committee of the Board, or the public accountant shall be sufficiently given:
 - (i) if delivered personally to the person to whom it is to be given or if delivered to such person's address as shown in the records of the Corporation or in the case of notice to a Director to the latest address as shown in the last notice that was filed by the Corporation in accordance with the Act and received by Corporations Canada; or
 - (ii) if mailed to such person at such person's recorded address by prepaid ordinary or air mail; or
 - (iii) if sent to such person by telephonic, electronic or other communication facility at such person's recorded address for that purpose; or
 - (iv) if provided in the form of an electronic document in accordance with the Act.
- (b) A notice so delivered shall be deemed to have been given when it is delivered personally or to the recorded address as aforesaid; a notice so mailed shall be deemed to have been given when deposited in a post office or public letter box; and a notice so sent by any means of transmitted or recorded communication shall be deemed to have been given when dispatched or delivered to the appropriate communication company or agency or its representative for dispatch.
- (c) An officer may change or cause to be changed the recorded address of any Member, Director, Officer, public accountant, or member of a committee of the Board in accordance with any information believed by the Secretary to be reliable. The declaration by the Secretary that notice has been given pursuant to this By-law shall be sufficient and conclusive evidence

of the giving of such notice. The signature of any Director or Officer of the Corporation to any notice or other document to be given by the Corporation may be written, stamped, type-written or printed or partly written, stamped, type-written or printed.

11.02 Computation of Time

Where a given number of days' notice or notice extending over a period is required to be given under the By-laws, the day of service, posting or other delivery of the notice shall not, unless it is otherwise provided, be counted in such number of days or other period.

11.03 Undelivered Notices

If any notice given to a Member is returned on two consecutive occasions because such Member cannot be found, the Corporation shall not be required to give any further notices to such Member until such Member informs the Corporation in writing of his or her new address.

11.04 Omissions and Errors

The accidental omission to give any notice to any Member, Director, Officer, member of a committee of the Board or public accountant, or the non-receipt of any notice by any such person where the Corporation has provided notice in accordance with the By-law or any error in any notice not affecting its substance shall not invalidate any action taken at any meeting to which the notice pertained or otherwise founded on such notice.

11.05 Waiver of Notice

Any Member, proxyholder, Director, Officer, member of a committee of the Board or public accountant may waive or abridge the time for any notice required to be given to such person, and such waiver or abridgement, whether given before or after the meeting or other event of which notice is required to be given shall cure any default in the giving or in the time of such notice, as the case may be. Any such waiver or abridgement shall be in writing except a waiver of notice of a meeting of Members or of the Board or of a committee of the Board, which may be given in any manner.

SECTION 12

AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLES AND BY-LAWS

12.01 Amendment of Articles

The Articles of the Corporation may only be amended if the amendment is approved by a Special Resolution of the Members. Unless the Act provides otherwise, any amendment to the Articles is effective on the date shown in the certificate of amendment.

12.02 Effective Date of Board Initiated By-law, Amendment or Repeal

- (a) Subject to the Act, the Board may by resolution, make, amend or repeal any By-laws that regulate the activities or affairs of the Corporation. Any such By-law, amendment or repeal shall be effective only from the date of the Special Resolution of the Members confirming such By-law, amendment or repeal, or from such other subsequent date that is specified in the Special Resolution of Members.
- (b) Notwithstanding the foregoing, it is not necessary for the Directors to pass a resolution approving any By-law amendment in respect of the matters listed in Subsection 197(1) before such amendment is presented to the Members for their approval by Special Resolution.

**SECTION 13
EFFECTIVE DATE****13.01 Effective Date**

This By-law is effective upon approval of the By-law by Special Resolution of the Members.

13.02 Repeal of Previous By-law

Upon the enactment of this By-law, all previous By-laws of the Corporation shall be repealed. Such repeal shall not affect the previous operation of any By-law or affect the validity of any act done or right or privilege, obligation, or liability acquired or incurred under, or the validity of any contract or agreement made pursuant to, or the validity of any Letters Patent, Supplementary Letters Patent or Articles of the Corporation obtained pursuant to any such By-law prior to its repeal. All Directors, Officers and persons acting under any By-law so repealed shall continue to act as if appointed under the provisions of this By-law and all resolutions of the Members and of the Directors with continuing effect passed under any repealed By-law shall continue as good and valid except to the extent inconsistent with this By-law and until amended or repealed.
